CHC30121 Certificate III in Early Childhood Education and Care

This qualification reflects the role of educators in a range of early childhood education settings who work within the requirements of the Education and Care

Services National Regulations and the National Quality Standard. They support the implementation of an approved learning framework, and support children's wellbeing, learning and development of specific community-based programs.

Units of Competency

A total of seventeen (17) units to be completed: fifteen (15) Core units with the following two (2) electives being delivered:

Electives:

HLTFSE001 Follow basic food safety practices BSBPEF301 Organise personal work priorities

Delivery

Duration: The course will run for a school year, timetabled from 8.30 – 3pm one day per week during school terms.

Delivery Mode: Classroom based tasks and assessments and workplace assessments, with possible excursions. Assessment and the relevant resources/guides are provided. Assessments may be completed in hard copy or electronic format; if the latter, students will need to bring a personal laptop with Microsoft Word to training.

Students will need to be working or volunteering in an early learning centre for a minimum of one day a week for the duration of the course and participate in vocational block weeks at the end of each term.

Prerequisites: Nil.

Location: At MacKillop Catholic College training room; vocational workplace and sites of interest. First Aid training will be delivered through St John's.

Cost: There is no course cost for school students; adults to contact the office for further information.

Recognition

The RTO will provide students, who successfully complete this program, with a nationally accredited qualification; or a Statement of Attainment for partial completion. All qualifications or units can contribute to the Northern Territory Certificate of Education and Training (NTCET).

Pathways

At the completion of the course, students may have the option to move into a Diploma of Early Childhood Education and Care.
