PRINCIPAL'S WELCOME

Dear Members of the MacKillop Catholic College Community,

As we continue to celebrate the Easter season, a time of reflection and renewal, I extend my warmest wishes to you and your loved ones. May this season be filled with hope, joy, and a deep

sense of spiritual connection. In the spirit of Easter and the exploration of faith, I'd like to share some insights from the Stage 2 Spirituality, Religion and meaning students on their recent Task, which sought to an-

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swer the profound question: "Why do Christians Believe in God?" Throughout their research and discussions, students explored various facets of Christian belief, drawing upon theological, philosophical, and historical perspectives. Here are three potential answers they uncovered: **Argument for Design by St. Thomas Aquinas:** St. Thomas Aquinas, a prominent theologian and philosopher, presented five phlosophical proofs for the existence of God, known as the "Five Ways". One of

these proofs, the Argument for Design, suggests that the intricate order and complexity observed in the universe imply the existence of an intelligent designer, namely God. This argument posits that the existence of natural laws, patterns, and the fine-tuned balance of the cosmos point towards a divine creator who imbued the universe with purpose and design. Personal Encounters with Jesus: Another compelling reason why Christians believe in God is through personal encounters

with Jesus Christ. Countless individuals throughout history have reported transformative experiences of encountering Jesus in their lives, leading them to a deeper faith and conviction. One notable example is the conversion story of Fr. Don Calloway, who went from a life of crime and addiction, including running drugs for the Japanese Mafia, to embracing the Catholic faith and ultimately becoming a priest. His encounter with Jesus sparked

profound transformation that radically changed the course of his life and beliefs. Historical Testimony: Non-Christian historians, such as Flavius Josephus, have provided historical documentation that corroborates key aspects of the Christian faith. In his work "Antiquities of the Jews"-Josephus mentions Jesus, acknowledging his existence, his crucifixion under Pontius Pilate, and the reports of his resurrection. While Josephus himself



did not convert to Christianity, his writings serve as external evidence supporting the historical reality of Jesus' life and the events surrounding his death and resurrection. These three perspectives offer different avenues through which Christians come to believe in God, highlighting the diversity and richness of religious experience and inquiry.

May this Easter season be a blessed and joyous time of deep reflection, growth, and spiritual renewal for each member of our community.

FROM THE ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL OF RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Easter is of utmost importance to the Catholic Church as it commemorates the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. It is the most significant event in Christianity as it affirms the core belief that Jesus, the Son of God, conquered death and offers the promise of eternal life to all who believe in Him.

Easter is a time of joy, hope, and renewal. It is a time to reflect on the sacrifice of Jesus on the cross and to celebrate His resurrection. Through His death and resurrection, Jesus offers forgiveness of sins and the opportunity for new life in Him.



The Stations of the Cross, also known as the Way of the Cross or Via Crucis, is a devotional practice that allows Catholics to meditate on the Passion and death of Jesus Christ. It involves reflecting on fourteen specific events or 'stations' that occurred during Jesus' journey to Calvary, from His condemnation to His crucifixion and burial.

Our year 12's, offered all students the privilege of understanding Jesus' suffering through actions and prayer, this was a wonderful experience to be a part of with an abundance of affirming feedback from the student body and staff at the College.



On Holy Thursday our year 12s students delivered an Easter liturgy with twelve of our students having their feet washed by Father Tom English and all they ear 12sthen presenting the College with the re-enactment of the Stations of the Cross.

The practice involves walking from one station to another. At each station, prayers are recited, and reflections on the specific event are offered. This allowed for our students to journey alongside Jesus, to witness His suffering, and to unite their own sufferings and challenges with His.


