#### PRINCIPAL'S WELCOME

Dear Members of the MacKillop Catholic College Community,

As we approach significant celebration of Pentecost the Sunday, we are reminded of the pivotal moment in Christian history when the Church was born. Pentecost, often referred to as the birthday of the Church, holds profound

significance for Christians around the world. It commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles and marks the beginning of their ministry to spread the teachings of Jesus Christ.

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The origins of Pentecost trace back to the Jewish festival of Shavuot, which commemorated the giving of the Law to Moses on Mount Sinai. For Christians, Pentecost represents the fulfillment of Jesus' promise to send the Holy Spirit as a guide and comforter to his disciples. The events of Pentecost are vividly described in the New Testament book of Acts, where we read about the apostles gathered together in Jerusalem, waiting as instructed for the promised gift from on high.

Suddenly, a sound like a rushing wind filled the house where they were sitting, and tongues of fire appeared and rested on each of them. They were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, enabling them to communicate the message of Jesus to people from all over the known world who had gathered in Jerusalem for the festival. This miraculous outpouring of the Holy Spirit empowered the apostles to boldly proclaim the Gospel message, and as a result, about three thou-

sand people were baptized and added to the fledgling community of believers that day. The Church, as we know it today, was born—a diverse and dynamic community united by faith in Jesus Christ and empowered by the Holy Spirit. Pentecost serves as a reminder of the ongoing presence and work of the Holy Spirit within the Church. It is a time for Christians to reflect on the gifts of the Spirit— wisdom, knowledge, understanding, council,













