




AHC21020 CERTIFICATE II IN CONSERVATION AND ECOSYSTEM MANAGEMENT



AHC21020 - Certificate II in Conservation and Ecosystem Management

This qualification provides the skills and knowledge required for work in a defined context and/or for further study in conservation and ecosystem management. Work would be carried out under general guidance and supervision.

The qualification enables individuals to select and develop basic factual, technical and procedural knowledge in conservation and ecosystem management for Indigenous land management, lands, parks and wildlife services and the restoration and rehabilitation of ecosystems.

Delivery

Duration: The course will run for a school year, timetabled from 8.30 – 3pm one day per week during school terms.

Delivery Mode: Classroom based tasks and assessments and workplace assessments, with possible excursions. Assessment and the relevant resources/guides are provided. Students will participate in vocational block weeks at the end of each term

Prerequisites: Nil.

Location: At MacKillop Catholic College training room; vocational workplace and sites of interest.

PPE: Supply your own clothing: shorts or long trousers, short or long-sleeved hi-vis shirt, gloves and sturdy hoots

Cost: There is no course cost for school students; adults to contact the office for further information.
