CHC22015 Certificate II in Community Services

This qualification may be used as a pathway for workforce entry as community services workers who provide a first point of contact and assist individuals in meeting their immediate needs. At this level, work takes place under direct, regular supervision within clearly defined guidelines.

Units of Competency

A total of nine (9) units to be completed: five (5) Core units with the following four (4) electives being delivered:

Core:

- CHCCOM001 Provide first point of contact
- CHCCOM005 Communicate and work in health or community services
- CHCDIV001 Work with diverse people
- HLTWHS001 Participate in workplace health and safety
- BSBWOR202 Organise and complete daily work activities

Elective:

- CHCCDE003 Work within a community development framework
- HLTFSE001 Follow basic food practices
- CHCPRT001 Identify and respond to children and young people at risk
- CHCVOL001 Be an effective volunteer

Delivery

Duration: The course will run for one school year, timetabled from 8.30 – 3pm one day per week during school terms.

Delivery Mode: Classroom based tasks and assessments and workplace assessments, with possible excursions. Assessment and the relevant resources/guides are provided.

Students will participate in vocational block weeks at the end of each term.

Pre-requisites: Nil.

Location: At MacKillop Catholic College training room, or other as negotiated; vocational workplace and sites of interest.

Cost: There is no course cost for school students; adults to contact the office for further information.

Recognition

The RTO will provide students, who successfully complete this program, with a nationally accredited qualification; or a Statement of Attainment for partial completion. All qualifications or units can contribute to the Northern Territory Certificate of Education and Training (NTCET).

Pathways

At the completion of the course, students may have the option to move into a Cert III in the Community Services, Education, Early Childhood or Health fields.
