STUDENT RECOGNITION









FROM THE MIDDLE YEARS CURRICULUM COORDINATOR

In the first two weeks of Term 4, all Middle Years and Year 10 students will undertake PAT assessments in Mathematics, Reading, and Science. For this session, the Mathematics and Reading PAT assessments will take place in the Library, styled as an exam hall, to gather reliable data and to familiarise students with the exam enThe PAT assessments, which are computer-based (laptops will be provided), adapt to each student's level of ability. These assessments are crucial for measuring a student's knowledge, skills, and understanding within a subject. This helps identify their current position in their educational journey and the next steps needed for advancement. The results are then utilised by teachers to


