# Remembrance Day Liturgy: Honouring Service and Sacrifice

On Remembrance Day, we pause to honour and remember those who have served and sacrificed their lives in war and conflict. At MacKillop Catholic College, we commemorate this significant day through a solemn and reflective Remembrance Day Liturgy. In a Catholic context, this Liturgy of remembrance holds a special place. It's time where we:

- Pray for the souls of the deceased, particularly those who have fallen in service to their country.
- Offer support and gratitude for veterans and their families, acknowledging their courage and sacrifice.
- Reflect on the Gospel values of peace, justice, and reconciliation, which call us to be peacemakers in our own lives and communities.

This gathering not only helps us remember the profound cost of war, but also fosters a spirit of gratitude and prayerful reflection. It is a reminder of our collective responsibility as a Catholic school community to work toward peace in our world, grounded in our faith and commitment to serving others.

Our Liturgy also included a powerful reading from Pope John Paul II, reminding us of the urgent need for peace and justice in today's world: "Many problems darken the horizon of our time. We need but think of the urgent need to work for peace, to base relationships between people on solid premises of justice and solidarity, and to defend human life from conception to its natural end. And what should we say of the thousands of inconsistencies of a 'globalised world' where the weakest, the most powerless and the poorest, appear to have such little hope! It is in this world that Christian Hope must shine forth."

As a school community, we stand united in prayer and remembrance, inspired by the example of those who have gone before us. We are called to live as instruments of peace, bringing light and hope to a world in need.




# PRESENTATION EVENING
