AHC10124 Certificate I in Conservation and Ecosystem Management

This qualification provides foundation level skills and knowledge required for initial work, community involvement, or as an introduction to further learning in conservation and ecosystem management. Individuals will need to have basic foundational, technical and communications skills required to undertake defined routine tasks in conservation work in a highly structured work environment.

It covers learning how to maintain a safe workplace, use and maintain small machinery used in land management sectors, plant identification, and support natural area conservation work in parks, natural areas, agricultural lands or areas undergoing restoration.

Units of Competency

A total of six (6) units to be completed:

Core:

AHCWHS102	Work safely
AHCWRK102	Maintain the workplace

Elective:

TLID0020 Shift Materials Safely Using Manual Handling Method

AHCMOM203 Operate basic machinery and equipment

AHCMOM204 Undertake operational maintenance of machinery

Delivery

Duration: The course will run for one semester, timetabled from 8.30 – 3pm one day per week during school terms.

Delivery Mode: Classroom based tasks and assessments and workplace assessments, with possible excursions. Assessment and the relevant resources/guides are provided.

Students will participate in vocational block weeks at the end of each term.

Prerequisites: Nil.

Location: At MacKillop Catholic College training room; vocational workplace and sites of interest.

PPE: Supply your own clothing: shorts or long trousers, gloves and sturdy boots. A hi-vis shirt will be supplied at the main campus.

Cost: There is no course cost for school students; adults to contact the office for further information.

Recognition

The RTO will provide students, who successfully complete this program, with a nationally accredited qualification; or a Statement of attainment for partial completion. All qualifications or units can contribute to the Northern Territory Certificate of Education and Training (NTCET).
