CHC30221 - Certificate III in School Based Education Support

This qualification reflects the role of workers who assist teachers and support student learning in a range of classroom settings in a primary or secondary school in Australia.

It provides the opportunity for growth in confidence and competence while working in an education setting.

Units of Competency

A total of fifteen (15) units to be completed: ten (10) Core units with the following five (5) electives being delivered:

Delivery

Duration: The course will run for a school year, timetabled from 8.30 – 3pm one day per week during school terms.

Delivery Mode: Classroom based tasks and assessments and workplace assessments, with possible excursions. Assessment and the relevant resources/guides are provided. Assessments may be completed in hard copy or electronic format; if the latter, students will need to bring a personal laptop with Microsoft Word to training.

Students will need to be working or volunteering in an Australian school for a minimum of one day a week for the duration of the course and participate in vocational block weeks at the end of each term.

Prerequisites: Nil.

Location: At MacKillop Catholic College training room; vocational workplace.

Cost: There is no course cost for school students

Recognition

The RTO will provide students, who successfully complete this program, with a nationally accredited qualification; or a Statement of attainment for partial completion. All qualifications or units can contribute to the Northern Territory Certificate of Education and Training (NTCET).

At the completion of the course, students may have the option to move into Cert IV in School Based Education and Care or a qualification in teaching
